



A FIELD GUIDE TO TRAVELING WITH A DISABILITY ... NOW AND FOR THE FUTURE



None of us may be able to travel back or forward in time in the “real” world, but everyone needs a way to get around and travel . . . even people with disabilities. However, many people with disabilities often lack the means to get around their local neighborhoods and communities, let alone travel around to other cities, towns, and places they may choose to travel to.

Some may have physical limitations, and may be unable to walk long distances to get around. Others may lack the ability to drive a car, and might need to rely on public transportation to travel. Either way, that doesn’t mean that people with disabilities are incapable of traveling.

In this presentation, listen to an individual with a hidden disability, who frequently travels around the United States (and has traveled abroad) for his work as a self-advocate for people with disabilities, as he describes the strategies he uses to travel independently around the country, and how people with disabilities can travel independently via public transportation in their local communities, and travel to other destinations throughout the United States and elsewhere, regardless of their abilities and limitations, and whether or not they are able to drive a car.

DISNEY PILLOWCASE PROJECT


THINKING ABOUT INDEPENDENT LIVING? THINGS TO CONSIDER IN PREPARING TO MOVE TO INDEPENDENCE


